### Performance Summary at end Sep 2023

In Sep23 our Fund was down 1.28%;

Year to date our Fund was down **0.99%**.

For the very long term of 25 years 11 months to end Sep23, we are up a cumulative 1,239.11%.

On annualized terms, we are compounding at +10.53% **p.a.** nett of all fees with dividends reinvested in SGD terms over the very long term.

### Review at end 3Q23

Markets were largely negative for the month of September, as the "higher for longer" interest rates sentiment became more prominent and as market players were faced with the possibility of a US government shutdown. The shutdown was temporarily averted as the president signed a funding bill to keep the government open, bringing a slight reprieve till mid-November.

China market conditions continue to show weakness despite some economic indicators recovering slightly, amid concerns over the property market and the durability of the recovery. As economic weakness continues, the government could introduce more measures to support the economy. I don't expect that they'll just sit on their hands.

Last week there was one (1) day of exaggerated panic when US bond yields spiked and we saw selloffs in the world, regional and local stock markets. I had a nice chuckle to myself as I considered how for one (1) day market players panicked. As founding director and CIO of Yeoman Capital Management I have seen 25 years 11 months of market fluctuations which makes for 9,460 days of seasoned, distilled experience. My team and I are strong, detached in our mental and emotional state. Sharp market moves do not bother us.

But please don't attribute our posture to plain bravado. Rather it is because we buy our stocks with large margins of safety, at substantial discounts to assessed valuation we know that we are not walking too close to the edge of the cliff (taking selfies and completely clueless about the danger that lurks). For this reason we can stay the course when other people throw in the towel for that one (1) day or longer. The days quickly add up, either for or against the investor depending on how his/her brain works (or doesn't work).

For our shareholders and ourselves, I firmly believe that over time we shall receive our due reward(s).
